# Big Island hosts Hawaii Film Festival

Though the Louis Vuitton Hawaii International Film Festival has mostly concluded on Oahu, the Big Island becomes the featured venue this week.

Screenings take place tomorrow through Friday at the Palace Theatre in Hilo, and Thursday through Sunday at the Aloha Theatre in Kona.

Four Hawaii filmmakers, including two from the Big Island, will attend sessions in both Hilo and Kona.

"Keepers of the Flame" is a tribute to three Hawaiian women, Hawaiian historian and author Mary Kawena Pukui, dancer and chanter Iolani Luahine, and kumu hula and teacher Edith Kanakaole.

Also attending will be Cam Eason, Kealakekua resident and writer/director of "True Love & Mimosa Tea," and Ryan Kawamoto, Pahoa resident and director of "Sand Island Drive Inn Anthem."

Eason's film is about a kahuna who brews a potion to bring two lovers together; Kawamoto's tells of tensions behind the counter of a drive-in.

Film festival movies this year include offerings from Japan, China, South Korea, Tuvalu, Vanuatu and the United States.
